Memorising Bible verses helps you to conquer evil

¹ Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. ² After fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. ³ The tempter came to him and said, "If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread."

⁴ Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.'"

⁵ Then the devil took him to the holy city and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. ⁶ "If you are the Son of God," he said, "throw yourself down. For it is written:

"He will command his angels concerning you, and they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone."

⁷ Jesus answered him, "It is also written: 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.'"

⁸ Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor. ⁹ "All this I will give you," he said, "if you will bow down and worship me."

¹⁰ Jesus said to him, "Away from me, Satan! For it is written: 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only.'"

¹¹ Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him.

Day 2 ^{BS} Psalm 119:9-16
Memorising Bible verses helps you to live pure

⁹ How can a young person stay on the path of purity? By living according to your word.

¹⁰ I seek you with all my heart; do not let me stray from your commands.

¹¹ I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you.

¹² Praise be to you, LORD; teach me your decrees.

¹³ With my lips I recount all the laws that come from your mouth.

¹⁴ I rejoice in following your statutes as one rejoices in great riches.

¹⁵ I meditate on your precepts and consider your ways.

¹⁶ I delight in your decrees; I will not neglect your word.

Day 3 Matthew 19:3-6
Memorising Bible verses enables you to give God's answers to man's questions

³ Some Pharisees came to him to test him. They asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for any and every reason?"

⁴ "Haven't you read," he replied, "that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female,' ⁵ and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh?' ⁶ So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."

Day 4 2 Corinthians 10:3-5
Memorising Bible verses helps you to refute human arguments

³ For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does. ⁴ The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. ⁵ We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ.

Day 5 Jeremiah 23:25-32
Memorising Bible verses helps you to refute false prophets (cf. Psalm 39:3-4; Jeremiah 5:14)

²⁵ "I have heard what the prophets say who prophesy lies in my name. They say, 'I had a dream! I had a dream!'

²⁶ How long will this continue in the hearts of these lying prophets, who prophesy the delusions of their own minds?

²⁷ They think the dreams they tell one another will make my people forget my name, just as their ancestors forgot my name through Baal worship. ²⁸ Let the prophet who has a dream recount the dream, but let the one who has my word speak it faithfully. For what has straw to do with grain?" declares the LORD. ²⁹ "Is not my word like fire," declares the LORD, "and like a hammer that breaks a rock in pieces?"

³⁰ "Therefore," declares the LORD, "I am against the prophets who steal from one another words supposedly from me. ³¹ Yes," declares the LORD, "I am against the prophets who wag their own tongues and yet declare, 'The LORD declares.' ³² Indeed, I am against those who prophesy false dreams," declares the LORD. "They tell them and lead my people astray with their reckless lies, yet I did not send or appoint them. They do not benefit these people in the least," declares the LORD.

³ my heart grew hot within me.
While I meditated, the fire burned;
then I spoke with my tongue:
⁴ “Show me, LORD, my life’s end
and the number of my days;
let me know how fleeting my life is.

¹⁴ Therefore this is what the LORD God Almighty says:
“Because the people have spoken these words,
I will make my words in your mouth a fire
and these people the wood it consumes.

Day 6 Exodus 32:9-14
**Memorising Bible verses helps you to pray
with conviction according to God’s will**

⁹ “I have seen these people,” the LORD said to Moses,
“and they are a stiff-necked people. ¹⁰ Now leave me alone
so that my anger may burn against them and that I may
destroy them. Then I will make you into a great nation.”

¹¹ But Moses sought the favor of the LORD his God.
“LORD,” he said, “why should your anger burn against
your people, whom you brought out of Egypt with great
power and a mighty hand? ¹² Why should the Egyptians
say, ‘It was with evil intent that he brought them out, to
kill them in the mountains and to wipe them off the face
of the earth?’ Turn from your fierce anger; relent and do
not bring disaster on your people. ¹³ Remember your
servants Abraham, Isaac and Israel, to whom you swore by
your own self: ‘I will make your descendants as numerous
as the stars in the sky and I will give your descendants all
this land I promised them, and it will be their inheritance
forever.’” ¹⁴ Then the LORD relented and did not bring
on his people the disaster he had threatened.

Day 7 Deuteronomy 6:4-9
**Memorising Bible verses enables you to
develop biblical convictions and habits in
your family**

⁴ Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one.
⁵ Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with
all your soul and with all your strength. ⁶ These
commandments that I give you today are to be on your
hearts. ⁷ Impress them on your children. Talk about them
when you sit at home and when you walk along the road,
when you lie down and when you get up. ⁸ Tie them as
symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads.
⁹ Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on
your gates.

Day 8 Psalm 1:1-3
**Memorising Bible verses helps you to
meditate on God, also at night when you
cannot sleep**

¹ Blessed is the one
who does not walk in step with the wicked
or stand in the way that sinners take
or sit in the company of mockers,
² but whose delight is in the law of the LORD,
and who meditates on his law day and night.
³ That person is like a tree planted by streams of water,
which yields its fruit in season
and whose leaf does not wither—
whatever they do prospers.

Day 9 Matthew 5:43-48
**Memorising Bible verses gives your teaching
authority**

⁴³ “You have heard that it was said, ‘Love your neighbor
and hate your enemy.’ ⁴⁴ But I tell you, love your enemies
and pray for those who persecute you, ⁴⁵ that you may be
children of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to
rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the
righteous and the unrighteous. ⁴⁶ If you love those who
love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax
collectors doing that? ⁴⁷ And if you greet only your own
people, what are you doing more than others? Do not
even pagans do that? ⁴⁸ Be perfect, therefore, as your
heavenly Father is perfect.

Day 10 Matthew 22:41-46
**Memorising Bible verses enables you to refute
wrong interpretation of the Bible**

⁴¹ While the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked
them, ⁴² “What do you think about the Messiah? Whose
son is he?”
“The son of David,” they replied.
⁴³ He said to them, “How is it then that David, speaking
by the Spirit, calls him ‘Lord’? For he says,
⁴⁴ “‘The Lord said to my Lord:
“Sit at my right hand
until I put your enemies
under your feet.””
⁴⁵ If then David calls him ‘Lord,’ how can he be his son?”
⁴⁶ No one could say a word in reply, and from that day on
no one dared to ask him any more questions.
